RESOLUTION NO. 18-65

CREATING SECTION 4.03(36) OF THE OZAUKEE COUNTY POLICY & PROCEDURE
MANUAL - RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS - SHERIFF DEPUTIES

RESOLVED, by the Ozaukee County Board of Supervisors that section 4.03(36) of the Ozaukee County Policy and Procedure Manual be created to comply with Wis. Stats. 66.0502 to read:

4.03 TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT

(36) Residency Requirements - Sheriff Deputies

- (a) Full-time sworn deputies of the Ozaukee County Sheriff's Office are required to reside within 15 miles of the County border.
- (b) All deputies hired or promoted to full-time sworn status must establish and maintain residence within 15 miles of the County border in compliance with subsection (a) by the end of 6 months after completion of any probationary period.
- (c) Full-time sworn deputies residing outside of the residency boundary in subsection (a) as of March 20, 2019 are not subject to the residency requirement until a change of residence occurs.
- (d) Full-time sworn deputies failing to comply with this residency requirement will be deemed to have resigned from their position.

Agenda Summary Creating Section 4.03(36) of the Ozaukee County Policy & Procedure Manual - Residency Requirements - Sheriff Deputies

BACKGROUND INFORMATION: Residency Restrictions. The Budget Bill 2013 Wisconsin Act 20 that was effective July 02, 2013 created a new state statute that addresses employee residency requirements for local units of government.

ANALYSIS: This new law, created statute 66.0502 regarding residency requirements. Under statute 66.0502, a local government unit is defined as a city, village, town, county or school district. The essence of this new law is that a local government unit may not require, as a condition of employment, that any employee or prospective employee reside within any jurisdictional limit except for law enforcement, fire or emergency personnel. This statute also covers residency requirements in employment contracts. Under subsection (4) of the new statute, a local government unit may impose a residency requirement on law enforcement, fire or emergency personnel that would require this type of employee to reside within 15 miles of the jurisdictional boundaries of the local government unit. The law clearly indicates that this residency requirement (of 15 miles) does not apply to a volunteer law enforcement, volunteer fire or volunteer emergency personnel who may be considered an employee of a local government unit.

To provide for an effective recall of sworn deputies during emergencies and enhance efficiency of operations for daily staffing requirements, the Sheriff's Office request approval for amending the Ozaukee County Policy and Procedure Manual to establish a residency requirement for full-time sworn deputies.

RESOLUTION NO. 18-66

DESIGNATION OF "WORK ZONE AWARENESS WEEK" IN OZAUKEE COUNTY FOR
THE WEEK OF APRIL 8 THROUGH APRIL 12, 2019

WHEREAS, in 1999, the Federal Highway Administration partnered with the American Association of State Highway Officials and more recently the American Traffic Safety Services Association to create the National Work Zone Safety Awareness campaign which is held annually in April prior to construction season in much of the nation; and

WHEREAS, the Wisconsin County Highway Association is asking all seventy-two counties in the state to unite and kick off "Work Zone Safety Awareness Week" with a resolution and campaign to raise awareness for its workers, the traveling public, public safety workers, and those of various highway contractors performing work for the counties; and

WHEREAS, construction and maintenance activities on our streets and highways periodically require that work zones be established; and

WHEREAS, there has been over 2,000 work zone crashes in Wisconsin in each of the last three years; and

WHEREAS, in 2017, Wisconsin suffered from nearly 2,700 crashes in road construction and maintenance zones, resulting in over 1,000 injuries and six fatalities; and

WHEREAS, between 2012 and 2017, there were 55 fatalities recorded as a result of crashes in Wisconsin work zones including three Wisconsin County Highway workers which were killed in work zones in 2015; and

WHEREAS, through their enforcement activities and other participation, the Ozaukee County Sheriff's Department, Wisconsin State Patrol, and Ozaukee County Highway Department are committed to working together in 2019 to keep our work zones safe; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Highway Administration has designated April 8 through April 12, 2019 as National Work Zone Awareness Week;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Ozaukee County Board of Supervisors that the week of April 8 through April 12, 2019 be designated as Work Zone Awareness Week in Ozaukee County.

Agenda Summary Designation of "Work Zone Awareness Week" in Ozaukee County for the Week of April 8 through April 12, 2019

BACKGROUND INFORMATION: The Wisconsin County Highway Association (WCHA) brought forward Work Zone Safety as one of their priorities over the last few years following the deaths of three highway workers in 2015. In 2018, the WCHA furthered this focus by establishing a Work Zone Safety Committee and beginning to lobby for several Work Zone related topics, including Flagger Reporting Requirements to issue driver citations, Drivers Education Curriculum additions to include Work Zone Safety, and Automated Speed Enforcement capabilities in Work Zones.

This year the WCHA is hoping to continue to bring Work Zone Safety into the public's vision by having every County pass a resolution recognizing Work Zone Awareness Week from April 8th to 12th, 2019.

ANALYSIS: Ozaukee County does not have any specific activities planned, but there will be some public displays and/or events planned statewide during that week, and I support helping bring recognition to Work Zone Safety.

Agenda Summary County Board Ratification of County Board Chairperson's Disaster Declaration of March 16, 2019

BACKGROUND INFORMATION: On March 16, 2019 the County Board Chairperson declared Ozaukee County a disaster area due to flooding in Waubeka and other areas of the county after communication with the State of Wisconsin's Department of Emergency Management.

ANALYSIS: Ratification of his declaration by the County Board is required per 323.14(4)(b), Wis. Stats., The disaster declaration shall be subject to ratification, alteration, modification or repeal by the governing body as soon as that body can meet, but the subsequent action taken by the governing body shall not affect the proper validity of this proclamation.

The declaration ensures that Ozaukee County and its municipalities will have access to funding should it be necessary to remediate the damage.
