16 Chairman Kriefall called the meeting to order at 8:30 a.m. Notice of Posting was given.

18 **MEETING MINUTES**

19 Moved by Ms. Deiss, seconded by Mr. Clark to approve the January 18, 2019 minutes, as  
20 presented. Motion carried.

22 **INTRODUCTION OF INTERIM HEALTH OFFICER – ANN CHRISTIANSEN**

23 Ms. Christiansen announced that she is the new interim health officer for the Washington  
24 Ozaukee Public Health Department. She is also currently the North Shore Health Department  
25 Health Officer. Her interim position will consist of supporting the management team, being  
26 present for emergencies, and support as needed until Ms. Johnson returns from sabbatical leave.

28 **COMMUNICABLE DISEASE REPORT**

29 Diana Noack, Public Health Nursing Supervisor, was available for any questions regarding the  
30 communicable disease report. Ms. Noack reported that there are currently no active measles  
31 cases. She also noted that there is a high number of vaccinated children in both Washington and  
32 Ozaukee schools. Ms. Noack informed everyone that Amy Braeger, West Bend School District  
33 Nurse, was nominated by Health Department staff and has been selected as the Centers for  
34 Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) Childhood Immunization Champion for Wisconsin.

36 **CURRENT ISSUES IN COMMUNICABLE DISEASE**

37 Ms. Noack again reiterated that there are currently no active measles cases reported in  
38 Wisconsin. Ms. Noack and her staff are currently working on sending out educational  
39 information to school districts, daycares, long term care facilities, EMS, and law enforcement  
40 regarding measles and informing them of the importance of having access to staff records and or  
41 immunity status. Ms. Noack reported that EMS will not necessarily know if they are transporting  
42 a patient with measles since it takes 1-2 days to confirm and therefore reiterated that the best way  
43 to keep staff safe is to know their immunity status.

1 **WISCONSIN 211**

2 Mr. Zils reported that he is a part of the Ozaukee Substance Use committee and they utilize the  
3 Wisconsin 211 as a resource for people. Further discussion and possible presentation by  
4 representatives of 211 will take place at the July, 2019 meeting.

6 **2018 ANNUAL REPORT**

7 Ms. Christiansen reported that every 5 years the health department has to go through a 140  
8 review which resulted in the Washington Ozaukee Public Health Department receiving a level 3  
9 designation in 2018. Chris Berg, Environmental Health Supervisor, discussed that his staff  
10 performs water tests for bacteria and nitrates in well water at establishments that are open 60 or  
11 more days a year and that have 20 or more people. Mr. Berg also recommended that homeowners  
12 should test their water every 2 years. The board discussed concerns regarding availability of  
13 medication disposal sites, which the department will be further exploring in 2019.
