### **CJCC Meeting Minutes – May 26, 2021**

The Criminal Justice Collaborating Council met via Zoom on Wednesday, May 26, 2021 at 9:30am.

#### **Call to Order/Proper Notice/Adoption of Agenda:**

Chair, Judge Paul Malloy called the meeting to order at 9:31am

**Approval of Minutes:** A motion was made by Mary Lou Mueller to approve the December 14, 2020 meeting minutes as submitted. The motion was seconded by Liza Drake.

#### **Coordinator Report:**

Ms. Grimm reported that:

- Drug Take Back Day was held in Ozaukee County on Saturday, April 21, 2021 from 10am – 2pm at Ozaukee County Transit Center and CUW School of Pharmacy
- At Ozaukee Transit Center site:
  - 51.5 lbs. of controlled substances collected
  - 326 lbs. of uncontrolled substances (pills, liquids, creams) collected
  - 11 lbs. inhalers and other aerosols collected
  - 7 lbs. epi-pens collected
  - 9 lbs. other sharps collected
  - Total: 404.5 lbs. collected at the event
  - 184 cars/households participated
- At CUW:
  - Total of 497 lbs. substances collected
  - Number of participants unknown
- Opioid Data from Wisconsin Department of Health Services
  - In 2019 in Ozaukee County, there was a rate of 11.3 per 100,000 opioid-related deaths and a rate of 35.1 per 100,000 emergency room visits. (State data was 15.8 and 43.9 respectively)
  - Partial 2020 data for the state of Wisconsin shows a significant increase in the number of opioid-related deaths. Since 2014, the state has averaged 69 opioid deaths monthly. Between January 2020 – October 2020, Wisconsin averaged 101.4 opioid-related deaths each month.
  - There is anecdotal evidence of increased stimulant and opioid co-use in recent years with claims that many dealers are selling meth and opioids together.

Judge Malloy provided comment on the increase in methamphetamines along I-43, notably in northern counties through Brown County and Sheboygan.

- There was brief discussion regarding when Ozaukee County first received TAD funding (2014) and when the Ozaukee CJCC was formed (2007).

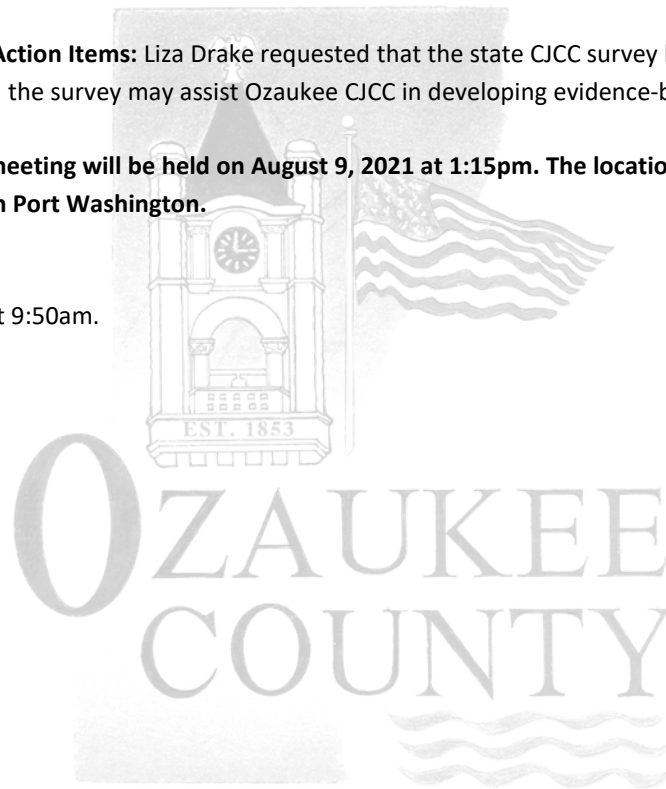
**Public Comment:** None at this time.
