Why complete Power of Attorney (POA) documents?

\*POAs allow **YOU** to choose the individual you would want to make decisions for you in the event that you are unable to make them for yourself. If incapacity occurs and you are without a POA, it will likely be necessary for your family or others to ask the Court to appoint a guardian—a process that can be costly, time-consuming and cumbersome.
