

DIRECTIONS

From the North:

Head south on WI-57 toward Fredonia. Turn right (west) at County Hwy H / Fredonia Ave. The main park entrance will be on the left (south).

From the South:

Head north on Interstate 43 toward Saukville. Take exit 97 for WI-57 N / Plymouth. Turn left (west) at County Hwy H / Fredonia Ave. The main park entrance will be on the left (south).

From the East:

Head west on County Highway A toward Fredonia. County Highway A turns into Fredonia Ave. The main park entrance will be on the left (south).

From the West:

Head east on County Highway A toward Fredonia. County Highway A turns into Fredonia Ave. The main park entrance will be on the right (south).

DISCOVER WAUBEDONIA PARK

WHY VISIT?

Waubedonia Park is the only County Park that offers camping. The park is just a short drive from the Milwaukee metro area, making it ideal for a quick weekend getaway. There are ten rustic campsites which are open from the first Saturday in May through the third Saturday in October, weather permitting. Spring is a beautiful time to see the variety of wild flowers as well as the migrating birds that use the river as a travel corridor.

At Waubedonia, you can fish for smallmouth bass and northern pike right from the front of your tent. Additionally, your boats, canoes and kayaks are welcome at the public launch at no cost. The park also has a rentable open air pavilion with enough picnic tables to seat 100 people. Electricity, banquet tables, and a large outdoor grill are included with your reservation. There is also a small section of the park north of County Road H for picnicking and fishing.

CAMPING:

Reservations are recommended for campsite and pavilion use. Reservations can be made for one of our 10 rustic campsites for a modest fee. If reserving a campsite on a holiday, 7 days notice is required. Reservation fees for overnight camping permits may be issued for up to three consecutive nights. Multi-family or

group bookings for campsite spots are possible, based on availability. It is recommended that reservations be made at least three days prior to the planned date. Reservations and/or changes to the booking must be made no later than 24 hours prior to the scheduled time or the full price fee will be automatically charged. Also, due to a recent infestation of the Emerald Ash Borer, an invasive beetle that has infected Ash trees in Ozaukee County, the park is in a quarantined area which prohibits the transfer of firewood into or out of the park. Firewood is available on-site for a modest fee. To book your reservation, call 262.692.2825 for updated campsite and pavilion availability.

THE HISTORY:

Waubedonia Park is the oldest park in the Ozaukee County Park System. Established in 1934 by the Rural Planning Committee, the park was originally the responsibility of the Ozaukee County Highway Department. The Ozaukee County Parks Department began in the early 1960's and has been caring for the park ever since. One of the first projects undertaken by the Parks Department was construction of the tennis courts and baseball field. With the removal of Waubeka Dam in 2004, the Milwaukee River is now free-flowing for over 15 miles from Waubeka to Grafton.

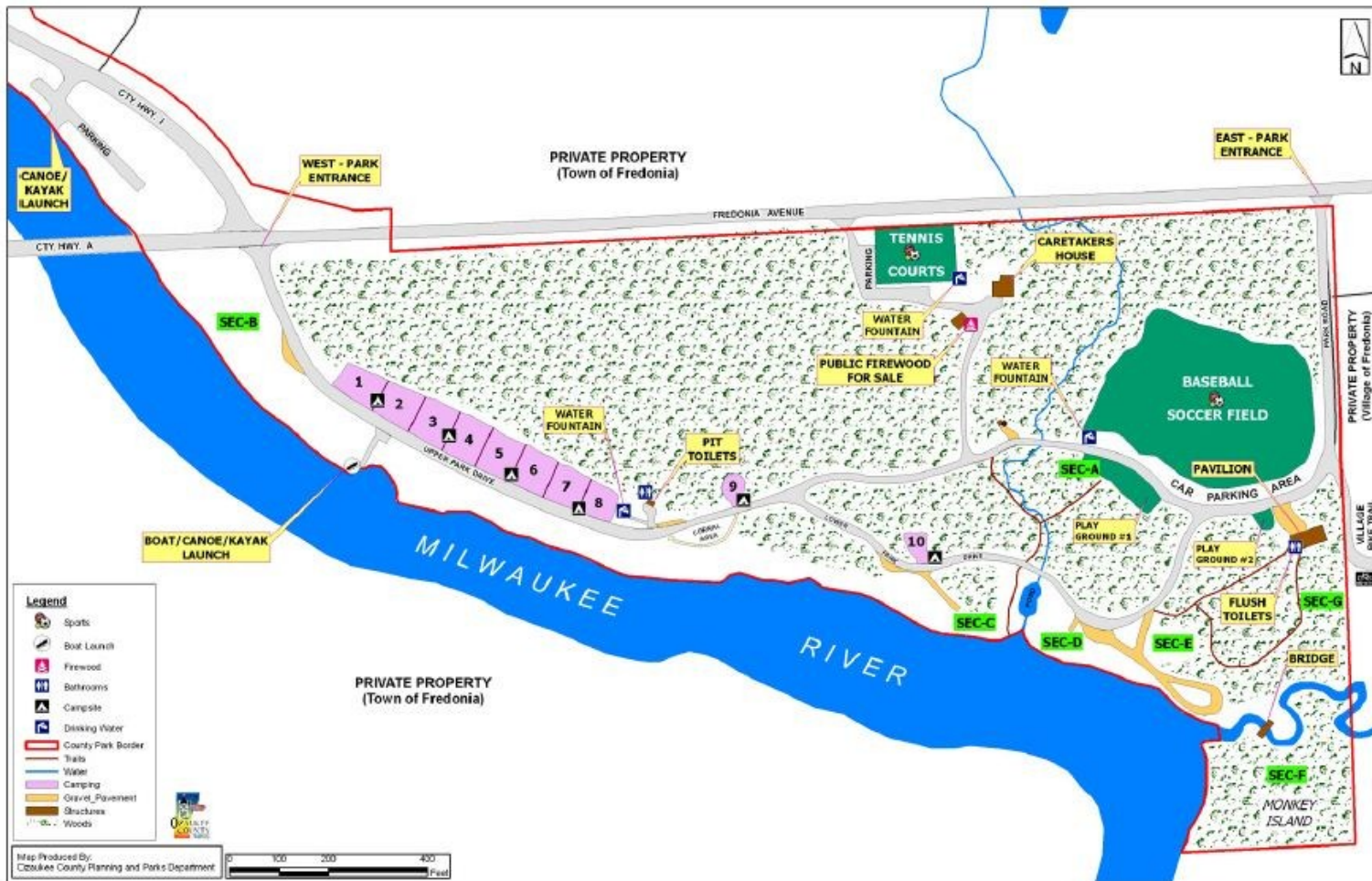

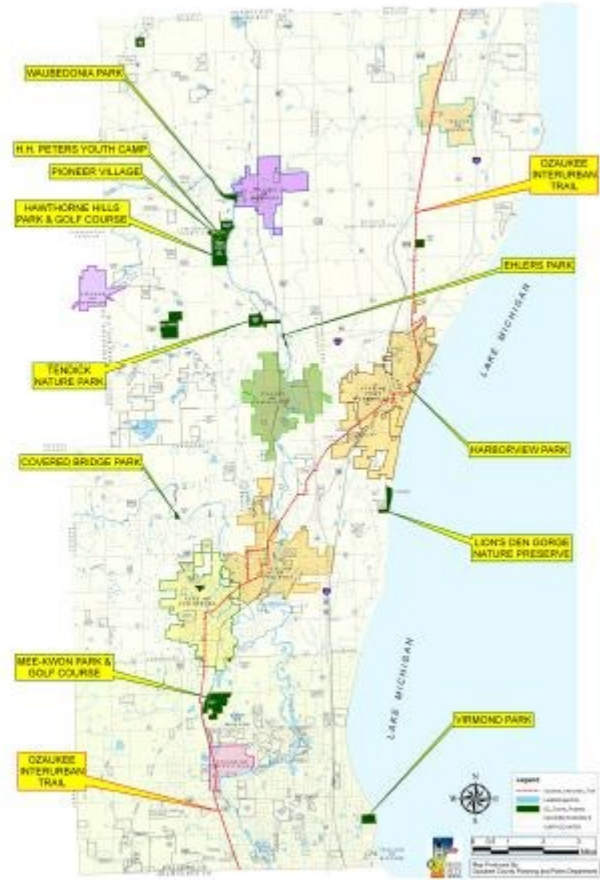
